

This month's Car Covers features a scene from our Garage Tour and Spring Breakout. Tom Scully's *humble* abode provided a perfect backdrop for the masses that flocked to this event. Old Sol was shining brightly, but the west wind kept the temperatures reasonable!!

1968 Triumph TR250 - Shawn Morton

Shawn has owned this 1968 Triumph TR250 since 2010. The TR250 was a short lived 'stop gap' car between Triumph's TR4 and TR6 models. Only a few hundred remain of the almost 8500 produced - all production was destined for the USA. In the UK and Europe, Triumph marketed the TR5. All but identical to the TR250, the TR5 came with 40 more of them important horsepowers.

Shawn purchased the car in Ohio from the third owner. The story was that the second owner owned the car for most of its existence, and only drove it sparingly and kept it garaged. The car came north with 4700 miles (although undocumented). From its wear the mileage seems right. Originality it is - from the Old English White paint to the original GoodYear G800 in the trunk. Shawn has done a few modifications to the engine, but all parts were saved and carefully packaged for a future return to full original.

This is not Shawn's first Triumph. In the 1980's he owned a 1969 TR6. He likes the uniqueness of the TR250, and when this one became available he jumped at the opportunity. A frequent passenger of his is youngest child Haley and in Shawn's words "here's hoping the next generation will someday discover these wonderful cars." [ED: Brilliant car - whenever I see it am amazed at how roomy the interior looks]

1975 Triumph TR6 - Harold Neustaeter

From Shawn's mostly original TR250, to Harold's mildly customized TR6. Harold acquired his car from his son as a means to reclaim use of his garage. It was a project in progress and in 2008 Harold enlisted the services of Todd Cathcart at Sports Car Parts to do the rebuild. Two years later, the car was ready to go. As evidenced by the "before/after" photos (see Page 13), there was a lot to do.

Some of the work undertaken: new metal panels, rebuilt engine block (with forged pistons, re-worked head with larger valves, camshaft, new carburetors) plus a Toyota Celica 5 speed transmission installed. The interior upholstery is new, including the hard top headliner, new seats, plus added the roll-bar, and a stereo. The paint is Corvette Velocity Yellow. [ED: Stunning. My project GT6 may get a Toyota swap]

Users will be charged an amount to cover the cost of ongoing expenses for some tools (most notably the welding equipment).

Some tools require training in their correct use before being let out.

People who ignore these rules may be banned from borrowing club tools.

Ron Tebo is the guardian of the VSCCC's specialty equipment, which includes:

EQUIPMENT

90 amp, 110 volt MIG (suitable mainly for body work and light gauge plate) with 75 % Argon / 25 % C02 gas. O-A Cutting, heating and welding outfit (weld / braze to 1/4", cut up to 1/2"). Light-duty 110 volt - 12 amp plasma-cutter (35 % duty cycle) with built-in air compressor (cuts up to 1/8" ferrous or 1/16" non-ferrous)

RATES

Weekly rental rates apply for specialty equipment. These rates cover replacement charges intended to allow the club to repair and, eventually, replace equipment. Rates are as follows:

\$5.00 for first week (or portion of the week)

\$10.00 for second week (or portion of the week)

\$15.00 for third week (and each subsequent week, or portion of the week)

These rates are in place to encourage timely booking and return of the equipment so that it can be properly inspected, repaired if necessary, and made available to other members. If you have signed equipment out for a lengthy period, you may be asked to return it, if another member requires it.

The above rates are based on minimal consumption of active or inert gases or consumables. If, on return inspection, additional gas, consumables, or parts are required, the member will be asked to pay replacement costs for those items.

MISCELLANEOUS

When signing out equipment, identification may be required. You will be asked to sign a form listing the condition of equipment and consumables and the time period required. On return, the equipment will be inspected to determine if repair or replacement items are needed and to determine the quantity of consumables used.

For safety reasons you may be asked about your familiarity with the equipment. Basic instruction and advice is available for those who require it. If you need more advice / information on the specialty equipment, please contact Ron Tebo at 403.253.0088 or email to mrtebo@shaw.ca.





Check the HVA and SEMA websites for legislation updates. Reportedly, some States are banning ethanol in fuels.


