

There is a \$50 deposit required on all tools which is refunded if the item is returned in good condition. In addition to the deposit, specialty equipment have weekly rates associated with them. Users will be charged an amount to cover the cost of ongoing expenses for some tools (most notably the welding equipment).

Some tools require training in their correct use before being let out.

People who ignore these rules may be banned from borrowing club tools.

Ron Tebo is the guardian of the VSCCC's specialty equipment, which includes:

EQUIPMENT

90 amp, 110 volt MIG (suitable mainly for body work and light gauge plate) with 75 % Argon / 25 % C02 gas. O-A Cutting, heating and welding outfit (weld / braze to 1/4", cut up to 1/2"). Light-duty 110 volt - 12 amp plasma-cutter (35 % duty cycle) with built-in air compressor

(cuts up to 1/8" ferrous or 1/16" non-ferrous)

RATES

Weekly rental rates apply for specialty equipment. These rates cover replacement charges intended to allow the club to repair and, eventually, replace equipment. Rates are as follows:

\$5.00 for first week (or portion of the week)

\$10.00 for second week (or portion of the week)

\$15.00 for third week (and each subsequent week, or portion of the week)

These rates are in place to encourage timely booking and return of the equipment so that it can be properly inspected, repaired if necessary, and made available to other members. If you have signed equipment out for a lengthy period, you may be asked to return it, if another member requires it.

The above rates are based on minimal consumption of active or inert gases or consumables. If, on return inspection, additional gas, consumables, or parts are required, the member will be asked to pay replacement costs for those items.

MISCELLANEOUS

When signing out equipment, identification may be required. You will be asked to sign a form listing the condition of equipment and consumables and the time period required. On return, the equipment will be inspected to determine if repair or replacement items are needed and to determine the quantity of consumables used.

For safety reasons you may be asked about your familiarity with the equipment. Basic instruction and advice is available for those who require it. If you need more advice / information on the specialty equipment, please contact Ron Tebo at 403.253.0088 or email to mrtebo@shaw.ca.

[ED: I wonder if those creases will 'buff out'?]



IN MEMORY OF

Kjell Qvale passed away on 02 November 2013.



The uniqueness of his name, is the reason why most of you will recall hearing of Mr. Qvale. But it is automotive legacy, which is the reason why Mr. Q is celebrated here.

As one of the pioneers for the introduction of European sports cars for the Western United States, we can all thank him for introducing our southern neighbors to the cars that today we love and cherish. It was his passion for foreign vehicles inspired him to import MG, Volkswagen, Porsche, Audi, Maserati and Jaguar along with virtually every other notable British manufacturer. [ED: How many of the cars that he imported are safely tucked away in Calgary garages?]

In addition to auto imports, Knell ventured into manufacturing (the Jensen-Healey and the Qvale Mangusta), building race cars and helping to found the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance. For those in to racing, think of him as the camera sweeps along the Corkscrew, for it his vision that is credited with the creation of that series of twists and turns at Laguna Seca.

Around 1948 he became the MG distributor for the West Coast and followed that up with Volkswagen in 1953. If one of your precious rides has Riviera Motors or British Motor Car Distributors stamped on it, then you can thank this visionary for having the gumption to bring these autos to western North America.

A foray in to racing during the 1960's, resulted in a series of BMC powered MG race cars. This included the "MG Liquid Suspension Special" that ran in the Indianapolis 500 in 1963-1965.

For our Austin Healey friends, the BMC's announcement that they were ending the production of that illustrious car resulted in Mr. Q buying the Jensen factory and working with Donald Healey they created the Jensen Healey.

During his 6 years owning Jensen, the factory produced more than 12,000 Jensen Interceptors and Jensen Healey.

Qvale's excitement for cars was possibly only surpassed by his passion for horses. Being a racehorse breeder with more than 100 wins was one of Kjell's greatest life pleasures. He was president of the Pacific Racing Association; Chairman of the Board of Bay Meadows Racetrack, Chairman of the Board of the California Jockey Club and owned several large horse ranches.

Mr. Qvale's automotive passion was also passed down to his sons. In 2000, son Bruce's Qvale automobile manufacturer created the Mangusta - an Italian sports car with a short 2 year production run.



Never too old - he started piano lessons at the age of 90.

- quarter-page flyer cards promoting SVAA are planned.


