
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CAR COVERS

The Porsche 911 is the sports car that has defined its genre like no other. Plenty of Stuttgart's finest were on display

at the 2013 ECCM - the Oily Rag is proud to honor them on our first cover of 2014. Not quite 50 for 50 in 2013, so we put the challenge out for 50 Porsches at the 2014 ECCM.

Introduced in 1963 at the *Internationale Automobil-Ausstellung* (Frankfurt Motor Show), the 911 first entered production in 1964.

Its distinctive styling with the engine in the rear and key to the left of the wheel has caused the blood of many a young boy to pump that much faster, including those young boys who are rather long in the tooth.

The original 911 came equipped with a 2.0 litre 128 hp 'flat 6 boxer engine'. Fast forward 50 years, and the current 911 comes equipped with a 3.4 litre boxer producing 350 - 560 hp (depending upon which of the 14 configurations is selected).

Outstripping the 400% increase in horsepower, is a 1400% increase in the price. And that is just for the 'entry level' Carrera, listed on Porsche Canada's website at \$96,200. Moving to a Turbo S Cabriolet, will see the price climb even more - to an eye-watering \$221,200. All prices are before kitting it out from Porsche's extensive options list.

The 911 is a perfect example as to how one grows with age. The 2014 model is 300 mm (12 inches) longer than the original and it has put on over 700 kg (1500 pounds). Despite the added weight, its performance has not suffered as its 287 kph top speed is 75 kph more than the original and the 0-60 time is 4.4 seconds quicker.

Thank you Dr. Porsche for offering the world a true automotive icon.

THE PREZ SEZ


Prez Sez - Jan, 2014

The Club has a good selection of tools available for short term loan to members only. All tools are to be booked through Alex Heikamp (403.239.0785). They should not be transferred from person to person without notifying Alex.

There is a \$50 deposit required on all tools which is refunded if the item is returned in good condition. In addition to the deposit, specialty equipment have weekly rates associated with them. Users will be charged an amount to cover the cost of ongoing expenses for some tools (most notably the welding equipment).

Some tools require training in their correct use before being let out.

People who ignore these rules may be banned from borrowing club tools.

Ron Tebo is the guardian of the VSCCC's specialty equipment, which includes:

EQUIPMENT

90 amp, 110 volt MIG (suitable mainly for body work and light gauge plate) with 75 % Argon / 25 % C02 gas. O-A Cutting, heating and welding outfit (weld / braze to 1/4", cut up to 1/2"). Light-duty 110 volt - 12 amp plasma-cutter (35 % duty cycle) with built-in air compressor

(cuts up to 1/8" ferrous or 1/16" non-ferrous)

RATES

Weekly rental rates apply for specialty equipment. These rates cover replacement charges intended to allow the club to repair and, eventually, replace equipment. Rates are as follows:

\$5.00 for first week (or portion of the week)

\$10.00 for second week (or portion of the week)

\$15.00 for third week (and each subsequent week, or portion of the week)

These rates are in place to encourage timely booking and return of the equipment so that it can be properly inspected, repaired if necessary, and made available to other members. If you have signed equipment out for a lengthy period, you may be asked to return it, if another member requires it.

The above rates are based on minimal consumption of active or inert gases or consumables. If, on return inspection, additional gas, consumables, or parts are required, the member will be asked to pay replacement costs for those items.

MISCELLANEOUS

When signing out equipment, identification may be required. You will be asked to sign a form listing the condition of equipment and consumables and the time period required. On return, the equipment will be inspected to determine if repair or replacement items are needed and to determine the quantity of consumables used.

For safety reasons you may be asked about your familiarity with the equipment. Basic instruction and advice is available for those who require it. If you need more advice / information on the specialty equipment, please contact Ron Tebo at 403.253.0088 or email to mrtebo@shaw.ca.
